We would like to make you aware of a situation that has come to our attention. The Boynton Beach Police Department and the FBI are working together to investigate a series of YouTube videos that are disturbing and reference a hatred of women. The individual who posted the videos is from Boynton Beach and went to high school with students who attend FSU and UF. The individual has no affiliation with UF or FSU.

No direct or implied threats to our students have been made. However, the FSU Police Department and the UF Police Department are working with Boynton Beach and the FBI to investigate this situation. A spoof Facebook page was created using an FSU student's name and is rumored to be linked to the individual in Boynton Beach. If you are aware of a similar situation here at UF, please contact the UFPD at 352-392-1111.


